- Governor John Kasich officially launched Ohio's Employment First Initiative when he signed Executive Order 2012-05K on March 19, 2012. The Executive Order established statewide collaboration and coordination by creating the Employment First Taskforce and Advisory Committee, and made community employment the preferred outcome for individuals with developmental disabilities
- The Taskforce is charged with expanding community employment opportunities by reducing barriers and aligning state policy

Competitive, integrated employment is the expectation for all youth with disabilities



Core Principle Two

Transition planning for youth requires multi-agency collaboration



Core Principle Three

Early dialogue with individuals and families is critical to ensuring employment outcomes



Core Principle Four

There are multiple pathways to employment



Core Principle Five

Person-centered planning is key to the development of effective services and supports for transition-age youth
